PRESIDENT: The Clerk now advises me that there is numerous filings on the bill.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Oh, okay.

PRESIDENT: So the question again is unanimous consent to lay over until Monday. Senator Savare.

SENATOR SAVAGE: I would like to object temporarily until I ask Senator Fowler a question.

PRESIDENT: All right.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Senator Newell said that Senator Labeledz and Senator Fowler have made an agreement to do this. Senator Fowler is in the body right now and he should be able to answer that question. I don't like to see Senator Labeledz bill sabotaged in her absence is all.

PRESIDENT: Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: You may recall, I had a motion to bracket the bill on General File and there was some extensive debate about that and Senator Labeledz, in response to a question, indicated that she would be glad to bracket it on Select File until after the Appropriations Committee's bills were considered. She gave me a pledge to do that and I think several other people may recall that she did make that pledge.

PRESIDENT: But this is a request to lay over until Monday, it is not a bracketing request. So I can't see how that could jeopardize Senator Labeledz's position.

SENATOR SAVAGE: I will remove my objection then.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stoney.

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. President, just for a point of information, I know that that bill was altered substantially with a number of amendments and I wonder if we will have an opportunity to see what the additional fiscal impact will be on that before we consider doing anything with it, because I know a number of us here will have to take a look at that before we will be able to make a determination as to whether or not we will support it from here on. Will we have that information?
