

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I know but just this one time let's avoid that.

PRESIDENT: Today is the day to be unfair.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Yes. I asked unanimous consent to lay the bill over.

PRESIDENT: Is there any objection? Seeing none, it is so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 711 was a bill introduced by Senator Ernest Chambers of the 11th District. Title read. The bill was originally read on January 9, 1978. It was referred to the Judiciary Committee. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. There are Judiciary Committee amendments pending. In addition to that, I have an amendment offered by Senator Barnett to the Standing Committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: We will proceed with this, but Senator Frank Lewis, the Chair inadvertently skipped over LB 271. You do want to take that up.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: It is noncontroversial.

PRESIDENT: Do you mind if we go ahead with, it is my fault. I skipped over it.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: No problem.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers, would it be all right to proceed with this one in order?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. President, LB 271 is a bill to.....
