CLERK: Senator DeCamp voting aye, Senator Savage voting aye, Senator Marvel voting aye, Senator Frank Lewis voting aye, Senator Goodrich voting aye, Senator Keyes voting aye. 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Reutzel moves the Call be raised. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 4 nays to raise the Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Call is raised. The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports that we have carefully examined and engrossed LB 697 and find the same correctly engrossed. Mr. President, an Attorney General's opinion addressed to Senator Maresh will be inserted in the Legislative Journal in full. (See pages 925, 926 of the Journal.) Mr. President, Senator DeCamp ask unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 818 in the Legislative Journal. (See pages 926-928 of the Journal.) Mr. President, a new bill, 897 A, introduced by Senator Warner of the 25th district. (Read title for the first time to LB 897 A as found on page 928 of the Journal.) Mr. President, Business and Labor gives notice of exec session on Monday, February 27th at 1:30 under the north balcony. Mr. President, your Committee on Ag and Environment whose Chairman is Senator Schmit to whom is referred LB 911 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation that it be advanced to General File with amendments.

PRESIDENT: Didn't we pass over yours, Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I have another bill on the Consent Calendar which is even less... I wouldn't want to take this bill even if there was no controversy, it requires more than fifteen minutes of discussion, but 618 I would like to substitute if I could? Oh, it is not on the list at all? Well, I have the wrong list then.

PRESIDENT: 711 is the only one on here, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I just have found it. It is on the list.

PRESIDENT: What is the number?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It would be 618.

PRESIDENT: I see it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Since I am taking this bill off, if anybody tells me it was an unfair thing, then just object and I won't try to do that.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: He has already substituted on the regular General File and I thought that was the substitute. This list I don't think, Senator Chambers, I don't think it would be right to do that now.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But, Senator Luedtke, even if I hadn't changed this location on General File, it would have still been on the nonviolent.
