LB 408, 618, 711

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Well, we're taking them but here is the point. 618, wherever 618 is on General File, where is it now? We are taking these bills up in the order in which they are on General File presently. Now you placed yourself in that position by putting 618 back down into the list.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, I didn't put 618 back down. I haven't changed 618. 408 is the one that I switched on General File. I'm not trying to get to 408. I'm taking a noncontroversial bill which is on in place of this one.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: I know, but you took that one and substituted 711 for it, right?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But 711 has been on the noncontroversial list ever since you have had a list not just today.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: 711 is no longer on a noncontroversial list because you have had it on the other list. You wanted it on the other list so it is on the other list.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Luedtke, here is what I am going to do. I am going to ask unanimous consent to 618 in place of 711.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: 711 is not on the calendar at all today. You don't substitute anything. It's not fair.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It's on here.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: It's not fair.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Luedtke, it is.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: No it isn't. It was on here but I have scratched it off because it's on another list. I made a mistake because it was on there the other day and my secretary put it back on but I just took it off.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Luedtke, what was done was on General File. 711 would have come up anyway.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Chambers is out of order because the list does not contain 711 at all.

PRESIDENT: Well I think whether he is out of order is up to the Chair but it is on my list.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: It isn't on my list.

PRESIDENT: It is on my list and I was advised after lunch to draw a line through it and I drew a line through it. All right. It is in order for Senator Chambers at any time to ask unanimous consent to take up a bill. Is there an objection?

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right. Go ahead.

PRESIDENT: Well, no, wait. Senator Luedtke, would you like to object to it?

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: I certainly do.

PRESIDENT: All right. There you are.
