

PRESIDENT: I am familiar with the rule. I would have to look at the bill and the amendment. We have got one minute to go anyway on our fifteen minute period. Maybe that is a merciful suggestion anyway. Let's leave it here and I will check it out for Monday. Is that all right? We are no where near getting... Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. President, I will put on the desk of every Senator the exact explanation of why Secretary Allen Beermann put the change in there. That will make it much easier.

PRESIDENT: All right. You might also give the Chair the advice of your opinion regarding the question raised by Senator Murphy as to whether or not Senator Chambers'... Oh, you are talking about the Committee amendments, not Senator Chambers? Will you give the Chair your advice on that over the week end too?

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: I will study it carefully.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. 772. 722. Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. President, both of these next two bills have substantial amendments and I would bypass them up until we have more time.

PRESIDENT: All right. 816.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 816 was a bill introduced by the Public Works Committee and signed by the members thereof. (Read title to LB 816.) The bill was originally read on January 12, 1978. It was referred to the Public Works Committee. There are pending, Mr. President, Committee amendments offered by Senator Kremer's Public Works Committee.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. President, before I explain the amendment I should briefly explain the bill itself. Current statutes allow motor vehicles to be equipped with two auxiliary driving lamps mounted at the front of the vehicle and stipulates they shall be no less than twenty four inches above the ground level. What the bill itself does, it brings Nebraska into conformity with the Uniform Commercial Code and gives you a little bit more variation as to the height that these auxiliary lamps shall be mounted. Now the Committee amendment strikes the word "sixteen" because of the small compact cars and inserts the word "twelve" which means twelve inches above the ground so it does give the variation where these lamps can be mounted all the way from twelve inches to forty two inches which brings it into conformity with all the other states with the exception of I think, two, that have not yet taken this action. So I do move the Committee amendments that amends the sixteen inches to twelve inches due to the small compact cars.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers. Senator Dworak. The question is the adoption of the Committee amendments. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to adopt the Committee amendments, Mr. President.
