LB 665, 590, 759, 458,
864, 902, 917

SENATOR DE CAMP: So I move you advance the bill.

SENATOR MARVEL: The motion is to advance 665 to E & R for review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Announce the vote.

CLERK: Read the record vote found on page 943 of the Journal. 35 ayes, 7 nays, 7 not voting, Mr. President.

SENATOR MARVEL: The motion passed and the bill is advanced and there is a motion to raise the Call. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 2 nays to raise the Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR MARVEL: The Call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Ag and Environment, whose Chairman is Senator Schmit, to whom was referred LB 864 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File; LB 917 advanced to General File with amendments: LB 590 indefinitely postponed; LB 759 indefinitely postponed; LB 858 indefinitely postponed. Mr. President, Senator Merz asks unanimous consent to be excused the afternoon of March 1 and then all day on March 7.

SENATOR MARVEL: Is that all, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 665 in the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR MARVEL: Is that it? Okay, we are on special order (b), consideration of LB 902. What is the status of the bill?

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 902 was a bill introduced by Senator Nelson Merz of the first district. Title read. The bill was read on January 17th, 1978. It was referred to the Revenue Committee. The committee amendments were adopted by the body on February 20th of this year. A subsequent motion by Senator Koch failed to be adopted. A motion by Senator Newell was adopted. A motion by Senator Stoney was adopted. A motion by Senator Venditte on reconsideration of a Goodrich amendment was adopted. I now have pending, Mr. President, a motion offered by Senator Chambers, "I move to amend LB 902, strike lines 18-21 beginning with the word 'any'."

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Clerk, would you read that again.

CLERK: Senator, "strike lines 18 through 21 beginning with the word 'any'."

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I will withdraw that.

SENATOR MARVEL: Any objection. The amendment is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have nothing further on the bill.

SENATOR MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Merz.
