SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The motion carries and the veto on LB 526 will be overridden. That will conclude the motions. Senator Carsten, I recognize you. Motion to raise the Call by Senator Carsten. All those in favor vote aye. Opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Call is raised. Yes, you may read in whatever you have to ...

CLERK: Mr. President, an Attorney General's opinion addressed to Senator DeCamp will be inserted in the Legislative Journal in full. (See pages 969-971 of the Journal.) Mr. President, Senator Reutzel offers an explanation of vote. Mr. President, Senator Warner gives notice of a meeting of the Postsecondary Education Advisory Committee for Wednesday, March 1 and Tuesday (sic) March 2. Mr. President, Senator Warner asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 611 in the Journal. Senator Newell asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 664 in the Legislative Journal. Senator DeCamp asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 202 in the Journal. (See pages 972, 973 of the Journal.) Mr. President, a new bill, 351 A, introduced by Senator Simon. (Read 351 A by title for the first time found on page 973 of the Journal.) Mr. President, your Committee on Urban Affairs whose Chairman is Senator George to whom is referred LB 781 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation that it be advanced to General File, 805 advanced to General File, 832 advanced to General File with amendments, 861 advanced to General File with amendments, 801 indefinitely postponed, 835 indefinitely postponed. Mr. President, Senator Koch asks to be excused on Wednesday, March 1 and Thursday, March 2.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right. If there are no objections, so ordered. We will then move to item number nine on the agenda, the General File. I believe the LB 99 was pending, wasn't it, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 99 was pending. I do have a unanimous consent request to bracket LB 99 by Senator Fitzgerald.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: By Senator Fitzgerald, yes, all right.

CLERK: Bracket until March 6.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: That is a unanimous consent request to bracket until when?

CLERK: March 6, 1978.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Until March 6. Is there any objection to Senator Fitzgerald motion to bracket until March 6? Hearing none, so ordered. Proceed then with LB 446.

SENATOR BRENNAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I don't think there is enough people in here to vote on it and I hesitate to ask for a Call so I would ask that this be bracketed until Monday.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Senator Brennan.

SENATOR BRENNAN: I hesitate to ask for a Call of the House.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Well now there are no need. Did you ask for unanimous consent?
