

Mason of Sidney, Nebraska to the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission, Hobart Boswell of Lincoln to the Commission on Firefighting Personnel Standards and Education, and John J. SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right. So you move to adopt the Committee's report, all ten of the names, Senator Savage. Any discussion then on the report of the Committee on Committees? Questions? Any discussion? If not, then the motion before the House is the adoption of the Committee on Committees report on the ten names specified by Senator Savage in his report. All those in favor vote aye. Opposed nay. Have you all voted? Voting on the Committee on Committees report on the ten names. Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the report, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The report is adopted. The motion is passed. The report is adopted. Any other matters to read in, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, Senator Kelly moves to advance LB 679 to General File pursuant to the rules. That should properly be laid over. Mr. President, I have a communication from the Secretary of State regarding our transmittal letter of LB 526 which was passed notwithstanding the objection of the Governor. (See page 1004 of the Journal.) Mr. President, new bill, LB 691 A, introduced by Senator George. (Read title to LB 691 A for the first time as found on page 1004 of the Journal.)

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Anything else? All right, as you have noted on the agenda we will recess until about 2 o'clock after we will have ceremonies out in the rotunda for Statehood Day which will follow our recess here in a few minutes, a couple minutes, and the Legislators and their spouses are invited as we have indicated for a couple days now, over at the Ferguson house for sandwiches following the ceremonies in the rotunda. The Speaker is going to request, I'm going to ask unanimous consent for insertion into the Journal of the document which will be read into the record out in the rotunda during the ceremonies which is called "Focus on Nebraska" which would take the days of Nebraska from the 11th birthday which we are celebrating now and the "Focus on Nebraska" by Mr. Denny who is being recognized out here with regard to Statehood Day. Is there any objection? The Speaker is going to ask that that item be inserted in the Journal. Any objection? Hearing none, then so ordered. Anything further then?

CLERK: I have nothing further, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right, the Chair recognizes Senator Savage.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Mr. Speaker, I move that we recess until 2:00 p.m.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Motion to recess until 2:00 p.m. All those in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed nay. We stand in recess until 2:00 p.m. We will regroup out in the rotunda for the Statehood Day's ceremonies.
