CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the Chambers' amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The motion passes. The Chambers' motion is adopted.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I would like to move to bracket LB 711 until March 6.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Do you want to just ask for unanimous consent to see if that works first?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh yes, okay. Right.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Unanimous consent has been requested to bracket until March 6th. Is there any objection. March 6th. All right. Hearing none, it is so ordered.

CLERK: Senator DeCamp asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 836 in the Legislative Journal. (See page 1012 of the Journal.) Mr. President, Senator Goodrich asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 92 A in the Legislative Journal. (See pages 1010 and 1011 of the Journal.) Mr. President, Senator De Camp again asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 210 in the Journal. (See page 1011.) Senator Barnett asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 640 in the Legislative Journal. (See page 1011.) Senator Bereuter asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 707 in the Journal. (See page 1011.) Mr. President, your Committee on Public Health whose Chairman is Senator Richard Lewis to whom is referred LB 572 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation that it be indefinitely postponed. 740 indefinitely postponed. Mr. President, Senator Bereuter asks unanimous consent to be excused on March 2. Mr. President, a new resolution introduced by Senator Marvel, Kelly, Rasmussen, Ed Dvorak, Murphy, Fitzgerald, Burrows, Schmit, Rumery, Moylan, Simon, Marsh, Kahle, Brennan, Cope, Maresh, Lamb, Hefner, Merz, DeCamp, Hasebroock, Savage, Nichol, Cullan, Chambers, Stoney, Duis, Clark, Luedtke, Barnett, Mills, Goodrich, George, Bereuter, Warner, Newell, Kramer, Carsten, Fowler, Keyes, Maxey and Kennedy. (Read title to LR 171 found on page 1010 of the Journal.) Mr. President, that should properly be laid over.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: It shall be laid over. Anything further?

CLERK: No, sir. I have nothing further.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The next two bills that would come up are on Education bills. Is there anyone that is prepared to handle the Education bills in the absence of the Chairman? All right, then the next one is the Judiciary bill. Senator Barnett, do you want to take up 169?

SENATOR BARNETT: Yes.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 169 was a bill introduced by the Judiciary Committee and signed by the members thereof. (Read title to LB 169.) The bill was read on January 11, 1977. It was referred to the Judiciary Committee. It was advanced to General File, Mr. President. There are amendments pending.
