SPEAKER LUEDTKE: May I just tell you gentlemen what will happen is that this bill will just be pending on General File next time we get on General File. I recognize Senator Clark for adjournment at this time.

SENATOR BARNETT: That's fine.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: I'm going to recognize Senator Clark. Bob. Senator Clark.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Savage asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 945 in the Legislative Journal.
