

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, this bill is not mine. This bill belongs to the people of the State of Nebraska and those people and those constituents of yours who fish for trout. I don't care. I don't fish for trout. It isn't anything for my district, Senator Dworak. It is for the people. Now the reason why the Appropriations Committee didn't hear the bill, and I think that you want to listen to this, is that the Appropriations Committee said we have so many things to do. We don't want some of those issues like that. There was no reason to try to go around the Appropriations Committee. In fact, some of those were sent to and referred back from Appropriations Committee, Senator Dworak. They knew the importance and they said we have got to work with these other areas and colleges et cetera. There was no reason for that to be heard or not to be heard there except that they didn't want to hear it. Senator Lamb is very concerned, and I understand his concern, but it doesn't have anything to do with the issue. He is confusing the issue, and when those of you who go back and talk to your constituents, in a few years, and those trout are not being planted in those areas of the State of Nebraska, not in western Nebraska, but all over central and eastern Nebraska, then you will know why this is happening. They are asking for \$150,000. It is like the bill. It is going to go across. It is going to stop until all those bills can be voted upon. There is no big fear of moving it across. Let it set there. When the time comes for all of those bills that have appropriative amounts, vote it down then, if that is the way you feel. But I think it should be moved across. It has an important merit to the bill and it is going to serve all of the people in the State of Nebraska who fish for trout. Thank you, Mr. President, I move that 586 be moved to E & R Initial.

SENATOR SAVAGE: The question is the advancement of LB 586. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Senator Savage voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Savage voting aye.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Will you please vote? Will you please vote? Have you all voted? Please vote. Have you all voted? Are there any of those that wish to vote? We need one more. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

SENATOR SAVAGE: The bill is advanced. The next bill is LB 582.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 582 was a bill introduced by Senator Myron Rumery of the 42nd District. Title read. The bill was read on January 4, 1978. It was referred to the Constitutional Revision and Recreational Committee and was advanced to General File. There are no amendments pending, Mr. President.

SENATOR SAVAGE: The Chair recognizes Senator Rumery.
