LB 109A

SENATOR KELLY: No. That was to be printed but not to be taken up at this time, Mr. President.

SENATOR MARVEL: It was supposed to be laid over until tomorrow?

SENATOR KELLY: That will be fine.

SENATOR MARVEL: If there is no objection, this motion will be laid over. So ordered. Senator Mills, are you ready for your motion to indefinitely postpone LB 109, 109A?

SENATOR MILLS: 109A, Mr. President.

SENATOR MARVEL: Okay.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I think Senator Reutzel had that motion up there and he was absent. It had to be held over for a day. 109A is not needed and I would ask you to indefinitely postpone that bill.

SENATOR MARVEL: You have heard the motion. Is there a second? Is there any discussion? The motion is...Senator Koch, do you want the floor?

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I object to the indefinite postponement of 109A. There may be a need for that piece of legislation before this session adjourns. It is obvious the Game and Parks Commission needs some additional financing. A bill that I have introduced before the Appropriations Committee could well be transferred to this piece of legislation since it is germane to the subject at hand which is immediate financial relief for the Game and Parks Commission effective July 1, 1978. Therefore, I object to the indefinite postponement of LB 109. It should remain bracketed where it is.

SENATOR MARVEL: Any further discussion? If not, Senator Mills, do you want to close on your motion?

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, I think that we have discussed this issue a number of times. Senator Koch, I understand and realize he has a bill that is pending and I think still in committee. The other bill has been moved forward. There is no need for an A bill with 109 and so it has been determined that, I have spoken with Senator Warner about it, I have spoken with the Speaker about it, I have spoken to Senator Reutzel, and those who are concerned with 109, and they all have said that 109A should be killed in the position that it really is before anything else to happen. So I would ask for you to indefinitely postpone 109A.

SENATOR MARVEL: Okay, that is the closing on the indefinite postpone of LB 109A. All those in favor of the Mills motion to indefinitely postpone LB 109A vote aye, opposed vote no. It takes 25 votes. Have you all voted? I vote aye.

CLERK: Senator Marvel voting aye.

SENATOR MARVEL: Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 4 nays on the motion to indefinitely postpone LB 109A, Mr. President.

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
