Now I don't care what you call it, whether it is harassment or something else, if the people don't want to fill it out and don't want to serve, you are losing those people to service in the government and that is free service also. For myself, I could care less, I filled it out even though I thought it was stupid when I filled it out. I filled it out anyway because that's the law and I have to do it by the first of the month. So I did it and I filed it. I don't even know whether they are going to accept it or not because you have several redundant things in there to fill out. It is just terrible. Certainly, I wouldn't want to kill this bill. I think this is the first time I have been able to give a green light to sunshine, so-called sunshine, because there is no sunshine in that bill, there is nothing in that bill to tell anyone's assets. They will have no more when they get done with it than they have right now. After they look at mine, they could get the same thing off of the county records if they wanted to. There is no sunshine to it. It is merely harassment and certainly I wouldn't want to see this so-called sunshine to go through and I think it is a misnomer the way it is. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Seeing none, it is so ordered.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.
