LB 665, 668

CLERK: Mr. President 665 has been replaced. We need to adopt the E & R amendments senator.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I move the E & R amendments to LB 665 be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cullan.
