PRESIDENT: No, no it requires a majority if there is a machine vote. It is usually done by a voice vote.

SENATOR BARNETT: Okay, that is all right....

PRESIDENT: Whenever there is a controversy we usually use the machine.

SENATOR BARNETT: That is fine. That is fine.

PRESIDENT: We are not accepting votes. Because we have got 24 to 2 and we would have accepted them. Please record your presence. While we are waiting for the Senators to return to the Chamber, under the north balcony Senator Hefner's brother, Wendell Hefner, of South Sioux and his associate, Richard Cave, from here in Lincoln are present. Would you stand and be recognized. Senator Martin Kahle has guests under the south balcony. LeRoy Nyquist of Axtell and Burdette Floodman from Stromsburg. Would you please stand and be recognized. Thank you. Excuse me, from Sioux City rather than South Sioux. We claim everybody in Nebraska. All right, the Clerk will accept votes. Senator Reutzel moves that the Call be raised. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 0 nays to raise the Call Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Call is raised. Report the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 3 nays on the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Jack Mills' sisters-in-law Elaine Westergren of Omaha and Marlene McClean of Fremont are under the south balcony. Would you ladies please stand and be recognized. 624A.

CLERK: Mr. President, the Revenue Committee is holding an Executive Session right now underneath the north balcony.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I move that LB 624A be advanced to E & R for Engrossment.

PRESIDENT: All in favor say aye, contrary say nay. The bill is advanced.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature....

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 722 the E & R amendments were adopted by the body on March 7, 1978. An amendment by Senator Rasmussen was adopted on that same day. Senator Chambers now has an amendment pending Mr. President.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, Senator Chambers informed me that he might be absent for awhile and asked me to handle his amendment for him. I told him I would be glad to do this. Senator Chambers amendment, I wonder if the Clerk could read it and then I will say a few words about it.
