

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Yes, we have to get the bill, Senator Rasmussen, then we will be ready to go. Senator Rasmussen. I believe this is the bill that the Secretary of State needs before the primary election.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Right. We visited on this a couple of days ago, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Right. Why don't we temporarily move on while they are looking for this to the next bill and we will come back to it immediately then. They don't have, we cannot take it up until we physically have the bill before us so we will move on then. Senator Rasmussen, we will come right back to it. We will move on to LB 777.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 777 was a bill introduced by Senator Doug Bereuter of the 24th District. Title read. The bill was read on January 10, 1978. It was referred to the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are no amendments pending, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Senator Bereuter.

SENATOR BEREUTER: Mr. President, Senator Koch has had a priority bill pending since last year, LB 44. I would like to have this bill fall in line after Senator Koch's bill is debated, as a follow up to Senator Koch's bill. Therefore, I would like to pass over LB 777 today with the understanding that it will not go to the bottom of the list as you indicated earlier.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: As long as you are here and ask to pass it over...

SENATOR BEREUTER: Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: ...the thing that I announced was that if someone is not here, it will go to the bottom. Is there any objection to this being passed over? All right. We will go on then to LB 612.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 612 is a bill introduced by the Constitutional Revision and Recreation Committee and signed by the members thereof. Title read. The bill was referred to the Constitutional Revision and Recreation Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are pending, Mr. President, Constitutional Revision and Recreation Committee amendments.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, this bill has a considerable urgency. It, basically, is a bill for the Game and Parks Commission to allow people when they use our parks, such as, Fort Robinson, and particularly Fort Robinson, that you would be able to use a credit card for that purpose. It has been cleared of any problems of constitutionality. I think it is important that we pass this. I was at Fort Robinson this summer. As some of you know, you must pay with cash or check. There is no other choice and sometimes that is surprising to many people because we are, indeed, a credit card society. The bill is urgent. I would ask for the adoption of the emergency
