SENATOR RUMERY: Thank you.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Labedz, oh, there's a motion on the desk. All right.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Barnett moves to amend by adding the emergency clause.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: I just move for the adoption of the emergency clause.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right, the motion is to amend LB 906 by adding the emergency clause? Any discussion on that matter? Senator Kremer. Oh, thank you. Any further discussion? CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Barnett's amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Motion carries. The Barnett amendment is adopted and now we'll return, Senator Labedz, to the bill.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you. I will just move to advance LB 906 to E & R Initial. Thank you.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right, motion is to advance LB 906 to E & R Initial. Any further discussion? All those in favor of advancing LB 906 to E & R Initial vote aye. Opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: LB 906 is advanced to E & R Initial. Next bill on the consent calendar will be LB 605.

CLERK: (Read title to LB 605.) The bill was read on January 4, 1978. It was referred to the Public Health and Welfare Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are pending, Mr. President, Public Health and Welfare Committee amendments.
