SPEAKER LUEDTKE PRESIDING

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Legislature will reconvene. Register your presence.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Dworak would like to be excused until he arrives. Mr. President, Senator Simon would like to be excused until he arrives. Senator Cullan would like to be excused until he arrives Mr. President. Mr. President, Senator Fowler would like to be excused until 3:00 p.m.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Record the presence.

CLERK: Quorum present Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Do you have some things to read in? All right we will proceed then this afternoon with Item 8 on the agenda, Special Order, not to exceed one hour. This is the one bill that was left from last year's priorities for committees which I apologize again to Senator Koch for not putting on. It is LB 44, ^{SO} Mr. Clerk if you will read it.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 44 was introduced by Senator Jerry Koch of the 12th District. Read bill.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Koch, are you going to handle the committee amendment or is Senator Stoney. This is on Government Committee Senator Stoney. Do you want to handle them or do you want Senator Koch to. Senator Koch, would you care to handle the committee amendments then too.

SENATOR KOCH: Thank you Senator Stoney for deferring to my position, I appreciate it. I also want to express my appreciation to Senator Venditte for allowing me the privilege to hustle this bill to the top of the list because of our discussion over LR 152. But, before we can speak to the bill in its entirety I would move for the adoption of the committee amendments so that we can speak to the issues at hand. SENATOR KOCH: The amendments that I have given to the Clerk merely bring the dates of conforming to the act in cases past into proper purview making it effective in 79 rather than 78. I suppose that we would have to adopt those after the committee amendments. We will adopt them to the committee amendments then. I will move for that.
