SENATOR CHAMBERS: But, that is what you said.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: I misspoke. If you had been up here all afternoon you might misspeak a little bit too.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Not I because I would know what I was there for.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Oh, I know you wouldn't, but I would. I admit that I make errors. I happen to admit that I can make a few mistakes Senator Chambers. Please record the vote. Announce the vote.

CLERK: 4 ayes, 25 nays on the motion to overrule the Chair Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The motion fails that the Chair has been sustained. We will now take a vote...we will go to a vote. Will you read the motion that goes way back to the original motion to advance LB 902 which would have been Senator Merz's. All right, Senator Chambers, I'll recognize you for that. Motion is to raise the Call. All those in favor of raising the call vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 5 ayes, 29 nays to raise the Call Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Call is not raised. The House is still under Call. We will proceed with the motion. The motion before the House is the advancement of LB 902 to E & R for Engrossment. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. All right, that is a reasonable request Senator Chambers. That is a reasonable request, that we find out that if everybody...We are under Call lets make sure that everybody is in their seats. Every legislator be back at their desks and once again we will make sure that everybody is here since there has been a lot of roaming around. So, would everybody please record their presence. This only goes to...those excused are not going to be brought in Senator Chambers. So that is all there is to it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You haven't suspended that rule. The only way you can properly rule the way you have is to suspend that rule.

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
