LB 812, 813

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. In the South balcony, we have another group from Senator Carsten's District. We have 47 9th grade students from Tecumseh High School in Tecumseh, Nebraska. Senator Carsten is in the East Chamber talking to a hundred students also from your district so that is why Senator Carsten is not on the floor. Thank you for being with us. LB 812.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 812 was a bill introduced by the Appropriations Committee. Title read. The bill was read on January 12th of this year. It was referred to the Public Health and Welfare Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are no amendments pending, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Don't I have an amendment there, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I don't have it, Senator. Let me double-check.

SENATOR WARNER: I will offer the amendment on Select File. LB 812, 813 and 814, all three bills adjust the inspection fees for certain activities that are conducted by the Department of Health. As I indicated in the discussion of the appropriation bills, they are set at a level assuming the passage of these additional cash funds being available to the agency. If you choose not to pass them, then we would have to replace the amount that would be anticipated to be raised from the adjustment in fees by increase in the general fund appropriation. LB 812 adjusts the cost for inspections of Class A swimming, correction, for Class B swimming pools which would be private owned but public accessible swimming pools such as you would find in motels. The cost currently exceeds the fee which is charged. It is \$25. The fee would go up to \$40 for those inspections which will come closer to reimbursing the actual cost to the agency. Mr. President, I would move that LB 812 would be advanced.

PRESIDENT: The question then is, shall this bill be advanced? Record your vote. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. LB 813.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 813 was a bill introduced by the Appropriations Committee and signed by the members thereof. Title read. The bill was read on January 12th of this year. It was referred to the Public Health and Welfare Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are no amendments pending, Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move that the bill be advanced. LB 813 deals with what is designated as recreational camps. These could be a variety of things from camps that are operated by nonprofit groups to dude ranches, or if we have any of that type of thing privately operated, the current cost that is provided by statute is a \$10 fee. The increase that is proposed would be one of not less than \$25 nor more than \$45. The current cost on the average for these inspections are now running at \$65 on the average. There is 104 such camps that the Department is currently

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
