

this sort of thing is allowed to continue, but most of all I think I should repeat again that this is one more intervention into business which we cannot stand and should not be required to pay for. I know people say that it sounds like the same old song, second, third, fourth verse. I'm sorry it is. I'm sorry we have to keep coming back again and again and again. I recognize that the Congress had good intentions but I suggest that if you ask your Congressman or your Senator about this type of activity by the Department they would disclaim any knowledge of it and they would offer the evidence that it is an agency activity. Now I believe it is time that we say no.

SENATOR SAVAGE: You have one minute, Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I think we should reinforce that. I think that the resolution if it does not so stipulate, should be sent to our congressional delegation and it should hopefully go with the full endorsement of the Nebraska Unicameral Legislature.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Is there any further discussion? Hearing none, Senator Kremer, do you wish to close?

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, I think everything has been said that needs to be said. I would like to add this and we need to be aware of this, that if manufacturers of vehicles of this nature and other ones too, we can't meet these government standards and regulations in this specified time, then the vehicle being regulated simply cannot be produced. That means jobs. It affects our economy. None of us are adverse to fuel saving vehicles. We know we need it but to place a mandate like this before a manufacturing group that cannot be met, cannot be tolerated. Those of us that are here in this room today and I hope many others should be concerned and we ought to voice our objections. We can do it through this resolution. Mr. Chairman, I again move the adoption of LR 180.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Senator Kremer has closed. The question is the adoption of the resolution, LR 180 by Senator Kremer. All those in favor vote aye. Opposed vote nay. Senator Savage voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Savage voting aye.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

SENATOR SAVAGE: The resolution is adopted. Next resolution is by Senator Cope, LR 183. Senator Cope, did you want to lay that over?

SENATOR COPE: Yes, let's lay it over for a week please.

SENATOR SAVAGE: All right, the next resolution is by Senator Hasebroock, LR 184.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 184 was a resolution introduced by Senator Hasebroock. (Read LR 184.) Mr. President, that may be found on page 1270 of the Journal. Mr. President,
