SENATOR SAVAGE: The Chair recognizes Senator Hasebroock to close.

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: There's no closing else that I move that the resolution be adopted.

SENATOR SAVAGE: The question is the adoption of LR 184 by Senator Hasebroock. All those in favor vote aye. Opposed vote nay. Senator Savage voting aye. Have you all voted?

CLERK: Senator Savage voting aye.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the resolution.

PRESIDENT WHELAN PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Number nine on your agenda, motions, not to exceed one half hour. Mr. Speaker, Senator Luedtke, is that one half hour each or total?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp moves to return LB 836 to Select File for specific amendment. That amendment can be found on page 1135 of the Journal.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. President, this is the amendment I screwed up the other day on General File and didn't get put on because it was worded wrong or something and then the bill went zipping on through and this is merely a technical correction to make quarterly reports instead of monthly or monthly instead of quarterly. Anyway it's just the Insurance Department's correction of that bill to make it more workable and it was supposed to have been put on before and somehow it didn't.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? The question is shall LB 836 be returned for the specific amendment. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: It's returned. Senator DeCamp, you now move the adoption of the amendment. Discussion. Record your vote. Record.
