SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right, this is a motion to just bring it out of order here today, the last bill. Senator Cullen.

SENATOR CULLAN: I remove my objections Mr. President. No objection.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right then it can be a unanimous consent request to bring it up at this time. So if there is no objection we will take it up.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, I'll be very brief. The committee voted unanimously to place this bill before this body. I told you exactly what it is. This lady lives in the Waverly area and has proposed a gift of 240 acres to the Games and Park Commission for their development. Senator Warner was the carrier of the bill and he can make any remarks that he cares to make. But, I ask for the advancement of LB 885 to E & R Initial.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: You can find it next to the bottom of your list on the first page. The Clerk will read the bill.

CLERK: Read LB 885. There are no amendments.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Chair recognizes Senator Warner. Anything you want to say Senator Warner?

SENATOR WARNER: No, I just move the bill be advanced. I think that....

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The motion to advance the bill. Any further discussion? Senator Kremer do you wish to speak? All right he waives it. The motion then is the advancement of LB 885 to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. To advance Senator DeCamp. Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, no nays Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: LB 885 is advanced to E & R Initial. That will conclude the list today. Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Is your last statement final? Is that the last bill?

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Yes, we are ready to wind it up, that is right.

SENATOR KREMER: The next bill LB 636 is a bill that ought to be passed. What happened several years ago, we passed a bill known as the weights and standards bill and unavoidably we took away the authority from the Public Service Commission to inspect these measuring devices at the elevators and they are waiting and they can't do a thing until we pass the bill.
