

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Deductive logic would tell you that there are two amendments up there. I think I can support both of them.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Okay, Senator Lewis, just so we all do understand what you've got here. You're not mandating or ordering or creating any tax increase through your amendment, and you are not doing anything other than saying that the Board of Equalization, as I understand it now, and I've just read it, shall comply with whatever the people order in that vote on November.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: That is correct.

SENATOR DeCAMP: So whatever the people decide in their vote will be what the Board of Equalization has to do. Is that correct?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: That is absolutely correct.

SENATOR DeCAMP: With that understanding, with an understanding that we aren't voting any tax increase, or decrease, or anything on this, and that all we're doing is addressing the issue of what to do with the people's decision, I would accept that amendment providing that you agree to accept my \$7.5 million. This is on the floor trading, right out here in the open. I want to make it that way so there is no misunderstanding.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Well if that was a question, Mr. President, as you know there are two of us in this state that do not trade, and that is me and the Governor.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Right. I know that, Frank. I know. I'm just saying....

SENATOR F. LEWIS: The amendments, as they are put together now, appear to be the logical way to go, that is with my amendment and yours.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Okay, let's do it.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Let's not carry this too far.

PRESIDENT: For what purpose do you ask recognition, Senator?

SENATOR DWORAK: Has there been a copy of these amendments printed in the Journal? Have copies been distributed on the floor? I don't know what kind of a situation Senator DeCamp and Senator....

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator. Could you tell me. Have they been printed?

CLERK: They have not been printed, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: They have not been, Senator Dworak. Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the only real question I've got over this, and it gets back to the jeopardizing of the \$55 million, I wonder if any of these amendments, or if this bill has any detrimental effect on that \$55 million. As I understood, before, earlier, we
