

PRESIDENT: LB 743.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are E & R amendments to LB 743.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move the E & R amendments to LB 743 be adopted.

PRESIDENT: All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have a series of amendments. The first one is offered by Senator DeCamp. Mr. President, in Senator DeCamp's absence, I have amendments offered by Senator Venditte. Senator Venditte is not with us this afternoon. Mr. President, Senator Barnett now has amendments. Yes, he's excused, Senator. Senator, this is your first set of amendments. Would you like me to read them?

SENATOR BARNETT: Journal...give me the page number.

CLERK: They are not in the Journal, Senator.

SENATOR BARNETT: Which ones are they?

CLERK: They are the ones on...read first Barnett amendment found on page 1411 of the Journal.

SENATOR BARNETT: That is the enacting date, the correction by the Bill Drafter is all, isn't it?

CLERK: I assume so.

SENATOR BARNETT: I'd move for the adoption of those amendments. I usually had those made in three copies, Pat, and then printed. Okay. This is the corrections we have to have. As I understand it, from the Bill Drafter, some of the sections have been repealed and will go into effect on July 1, 1978, and yet we have to, by adopting Senator Carsten's amendment, put it off till January 1st. So we'll have to have penalty sections available for those certain acts that have been repealed. That would, basically,...it's rather complicated I guess. What we have to do is maintain penalties. This amendment will maintain the penalties until January 1st. I'd move for the adoption of that amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? The question is the adoption of Senator Barnett's amendment to LB 743. Record your vote. Have you voted? Could I have your attention, please. Thank you. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Barnett's first amendment, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: It is adopted. Senator Barnett.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Barnett now moves to amend. These are the amendments you brought up to me earlier this afternoon, Senator.

SENATOR BARNETT: I'd move for the adoption of these amendments. I'd like to have the Clerk read these amendments so that everybody pays attention. I don't think it's necessary for me to repeat it after he said it. So, Pat, would you go ahead and read this amendment.
