

SENATOR WARNER: Thank you, Mr. President. There are a series of amendments for LB 953 and I will break up offering those amendments where I think you may want to have more discussion, perhaps. Some of them are corrective in nature. There are some which add general fund money over and above what is currently in the bill and there are amendments which reduce the general fund impact. If all the amendments are adopted that are proposed here, the summary sheet will indicate a reduction of \$923,976 of general fund money, as far as the total appropriation as contained in LB 953. That will be the net decrease in the general fund appropriation. To add confusion, it will appear to be \$1,632,180 but in reality the actual reduction is \$923,000 because part of the things that we are proposing here effecting the Board of Education Lands and Funds has no net effect actually upon the expenditures. Mr. President and Mr. Clerk, I will move adoption of amendment (1), (2), (3), and (4) first.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Any discussion? The question is the adoption....

SENATOR WARNER: I had better explain them, Mr. President.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Continue. Pat, Senator Warner wants you.

SENATOR WARNER: I am moving (1), (2), (3), and (4) only first. Have you got it?

CLERK: Okay, thank you, Senator.

SENATOR WARNER: Amendment (1) is purely corrective, no impact, drafting computation errors. Amendment (2) is an authorization for additional \$10,000 cash fund authorization for the State Historical Society. They currently have people where construction is taking place in state projects, particularly road programs, and if in the process of construction, there is some archeological discovery made, under contractual relationship with the appropriate agency, the Historical Society have people who can come out and immediately survey the contents of that find and recover those artifacts or other historical significant items while the construction is going on and this is an increase of that cash fund authorization of \$10,000. Amendment (3) is no change in general fund money. It is an adjustment in salary limitations between programs in the Liquor Control Commission. Amendment (4) deals with the Poultry and Egg Development program which is a totally cash funded program and it is an adjustment in salary limitation, as indicated, to reflect the change in accounting for salaries due to a recent audit. Mr. President, I move adoption of those four amendments.

SENATOR SAVAGE: All right. Any discussion? The question is adoption of amendments (1), (2), (3), and (4). All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Will you please vote? Can we get some of the Senators in from the rotunda so that we can proceed with the business at hand. Savage voting aye. Have you all voted?

CLERK: Senator Savage voting aye.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Record.
