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it over, be fair to the City of Omaha, be fair to the people of Omaha and be fair to the Legislature and I think the only way we can do it because of Easter and time limitation is to handle it today.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich, please confine your remarks to the motion to suspend the rules.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Would Senator DeCamp yield to a question please?

SENATOR DE CAMP: Yes.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Senator DeCamp, for example is there any reason in your mind at least, why we can't delay this particular motion? I know we're up to the agenda item of Final Reading, where Final Reading would ordinarily fall, but this would not be the first time we ever delayed Final Reading. We've done that several times in the eight years I've been here.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Sure.

SENATOR GOODRICH: My thought was, is there any reason we cannot just delay the taking up of your motion and take up the special order bill and then that will give the, like Senator Kremer, Senator Newell, Senator Koch, Senator Frank Lewis, a few of those Senators, time enough to get here.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Well, let me throw this out and just see how it sounds. What about just setting this to be taken up at 1:30? Does that make some sense?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes, that would be all right, fine. Let's make it 2 o'clock or something like that.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Well, of course this is Easter. People are going to go home for Easter. Maybe 11:30, just before noon.

SENATOR GOODRICH: That's fine. Be it 11:00 or 11:30, either one.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Governor Whelan, does 11 o'clock sound okay, or 11:30?

PRESIDENT: Well, this is a matter for the Speaker. The Presiding Officer does not set the order.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Sure. Mr. Speaker, is it okay to take this up at 11:00?

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: When?

SENATOR DE CAMP: This morning.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: I thought we were going on priority bills.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Yes, we were going to do that but couldn't we just take a little time out.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: That's why we're never on priority bills.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. Speaker, you know...

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
