

privately do now is done at a total cost of \$38,000, \$38,200. Therefore, the state inspection would also be more economical. I move for the adoption of the amendment. I am sorry, Mr. President, I have to move the bill back to Select File for specific amendment first. That should be my motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, it was my privilege to point out to the body that we were going to use tax money in public power, which generates its income and pays all of its expenses out of electrical rates. It appears now that Senator George has correctly identified the expense of this inspection with the power districts and those nuclear facilities that need inspection and will not be using tax funds but will be using fees paid by the power districts, the nuclear generating units, to the Department of Health to do the inspecting and the reporting in this area. If, in fact, these amendments to LR 814 do accomplish this, it certainly deserves my support and deserves your support as members of the Legislature.

PRESIDENT: Are you ready for the vote, Senator George?

SENATOR GEORGE: Yes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right, the question is, shall LR 814 be returned for the specific amendment. Record your vote. Have you voted? Have you voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay on the motion to return, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is returned. Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, I now move for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Record your vote. Please vote. Record. Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, I hesitate to do that but I think I have to have a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the House go under Call? Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 1 nay to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Clerk will accept votes.

CLERK: Senator Barnett voting aye. Senator Luedtke voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Report the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 5 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator George's amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nichol moves the Call be raised. Record your vote on that. Record.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 0 nays to raise the Call, Mr. President.
