SENATOR GOODRICH: Call it forty-one or forty-two, whatever it is. I just don't see how we can sit here and argue over that much money. Let's give the man the amendment he needs. Let's get on with the business at hand. Thank you very much. I wholeheartedly support Senator Clark.

PRESIDENT: That is the last of the...Senator Clark, would you close please?

SENATOR CLARK: There is no closing. I just ask the bill brought back for a specific amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is returned. Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: I'd move for the adoption of the amendment, please.

PRESIDENT: Record your vote. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 1 nay on the adoption of Senator Clark's amendment.

PRESIDENT: It is adopted, Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: I move the bill be returned to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT: All in favor say aye, contrary say nay. The bill is readvanced.

CLERK: Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: What have you got? Do you want to return that bill for the emergency clause, Senator Clark? Do you want to return that bill for the emergency clause, too?

SENATOR CLARK: Yes, pardon me. I would like to return the bill for the emergency clause.

PRESIDENT: That is the motion. Record your vote. Record.
