So would you, we will start today now with this particular final priority list with the understanding that Senator Newell has changed his, but if anybody else wants to change it, let me know right now. Otherwise, we are going to go with this list right now, before we get started. Does anybody else want to change, because we will make a revised list?

PRESIDENT: Senator Koch, do you want to change something on your list? Your light is on.

SENATOR KOCH: I want to speak to 192, sir.

PRESIDENT: Oh, okay. Senator Duis, did you want to address yourself to the Speaker's.

SENATOR DUIS: Yes, if I might please. Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Yes.

SENATOR DUIS: My problem is this, I have watched my particular bill and I have dropped back a couple of times thinking it might be coming up but the situation that bothers me is that if someone would change the number of their bill to be higher up there and then take the insides out of the bill and then they could....Well, we just had that happen in the last couple of days a couple of times and I am a little concerned here as to....

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: I agree with you there.

SENATOR DUIS: ...this situation that I could pick a bill probably way up the line and put the number in and then ask to have it amended and then here we go.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: I would agree with you on that. If anybody did that under priority bills, that certainly I would not recognize that as a priority bill. A priority bill has to be the bill that was before the committee. Has to be.

SENATOR DUIS: The only thing I am afraid of that, we won't know that until the day it comes up and he puts an amendment up there or she.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: I agree with you completely. I agree completely with you and I think everybody ought to understand your point and say it is well taken.

SENATOR DUIS: I think it concerns us, Senator Luedtke, again, as much as that, for instance, on consent list, I sat around two Fridays waiting to come up. Then I get to within about three bills of it, then we go to the priority. Of course, that is the nature of the game. But here I have also watched my priority one drop two, three notches, as people have changed their numbers.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: There haven't been too many changes and I hope there won't be, but I am just saying, if there are any more this afternoon, I don't think we should change
