CLERK: (Read roll call vote found on pages 1595 and 1596 of the Journal.) 26 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return.

PRESIDENT: The bill shall be returned. Senator Stoney moves that the Call be raised. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 12 nays to raise the Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Call is raised. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move that the amendment be adopted so I can resume the discussion.

PRESIDENT: All right. That's the motion. Record your vote. It's the adoption of the amendment. The last motion was to return the bill for this specific amendment. Please vote. Record. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Call of the House, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Record the vote or we're going to have to put the House under Call again. The question is shall the House go under Call. Record your vote. Have you voted? The question is shall we go under Call. Record your vote, or record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 2 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We are under Call. Please return to your desks and record your presence. The Clerk will take votes. Please record your presence. Will the Sergeant at Arms find the membership and have them return to the chamber? The Clerk shall not take votes. We'll have a roll call. We are under Call. Senator Cope. Senator Nichol. Senator Cullan. We are missing Senator Stoney. Missing Senator Cullan and Senator Brennan. Stoney. Senator Chambers, may we commence the roll? Commence the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote found on pages 1596 and 1597 of the Journal.) 25 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the Warner amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Move the bill be advanced.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye. All right, there is a request for a machine vote to advance the bill. Record your vote. We're under Call. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 9 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Senator Stoney moves that the Call be raised as he's leaving the chamber. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 6 nays to raise the Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Call is raised. The Clerk has some things to read in the record.
