

this act shall not apply to this type of activity.

SENATOR BARNETT: Okay, but, let me ask this question, then, in sections 1, 2 and 3, do you still plan on having restrictions on the community college boards or the technical school boards to regulate how they can go about with capital construction, a moratorium, so to speak, irregardless of what this amendment does?

SENATOR CULLAN: Yes, sir.

SENATOR BARNETT: This amendment just....

SENATOR CULLAN: This is just a technical amendment to ensure that if the other amendments are adopted, they will be able to carry on miscellaneous renovation and maintenance and just to make it clear. I don't think this amendment is necessary but I think it does make it a little more clear to ensure that they can continue routine maintenance. That is the only purpose of this amendment.

SENATOR BARNETT: Okay, then with that amendment, then I am still going to reserve to talk on the other amendment after this one is over with.

SENATOR CULLAN: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Maresh, do you want to speak to this amendment or to the full amendment?

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, a question of Senator Cullan, say if a new roof is needed on a building and costs more than \$50,000, it would have to be a vote of the people? Is that right?

SENATOR CULLAN: I am not sure that would be a vote of the people or not, Senator Maresh. I assume it would be, yes.

SENATOR MARESH: Would new equipment for a school be considered capital construction?

SENATOR CULLAN: No, it would not, not new equipment.

SENATOR MARESH: Regardless of the price, right, the price tag on it?

SENATOR CULLAN: New equipment would not be considered new capital construction.

SENATOR MARESH: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR CULLAN: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Do you wish to close, Senator Cullan? The question then is the adoption of Senator Cullan's amendment to his amendment. Record your vote. We are on Select File. This requires 25 votes on an amendment to an amendment. Have you voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Cullan's amendment.
