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SENATOR F. LEWIS: Yes.

SENATOR WARNER: Well then that's a different proposition, I believe that you are offering.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Senator Warner, I certainly wasn't offering any proposition. I was trying to speculate aloud in my mind in terms of the logistics and the strategy sometimes gets (interruption.)

SENATOR WARNER: That was the terms which I thought your words were spoken.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. President, again we have a school in trouble there. We're asking that that school four hundred miles from my district be provided a one year chance in terms of trying to put themselves in a stable situation. I certainly do not mind if we go through the process of an appropriation bill, but I do urge you to support this particular amendment and I know we're going to lose a little here, we're going to lose a little there, but I think in terms of strengthening the overall structure, giving us a year to try to straighten out the formula, this is the best approach I know. I urge you to adopt the motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Simon. Senator Marvel. Are there five seconds? There are. The question is shall debate now cease. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 2 nays on the motion to cease debate, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Debate ceases. Senator Nichol.

SENATOR BEREUTER: Request a record vote.

PRESIDENT: Oh.

CLERK: Senator Kremer voting no.
