PRESIDENT: Do you want to close, Senator? Oh, Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: A question of the Clerk. Pat, what page is the Governor's veto on in the Journal? I was trying to see what his reasons were. I can't find it.

CLERK: Senator, I believe it's 1379. 1379.

PRESIDENT: Are you ready to close, Senator Mills?

SENATOR MILLS: Yes, I didn't realize Senator Warner was finished, but I want to. If he is, I don't want to interrupt him. Okay. Members of the Legislature, I think that again I want to bring to you the important fact that this is not building a new place. It's not for the area. It's not for the forty fourth district. It's for all those people, those constituents of yours in the State of Nebraska who do like to fish and do use trout. It's the only one in Nebraska, the only hatchery that's successful. It is completing, not a brand new project, but completing phase three. It is sorely needed and I hope that you can see fit to override the Governor's veto and at this time reconsider our action. I urge you to vote for the reconsideration.

PRESIDENT: Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record. Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, is that thirty votes?

PRESIDENT: No, twenty five.

SENATOR MILLS: Thank you.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 13 nays to reconsider our action, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right. What else do you have on this?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Mills now moves to suspend Rule 6, Section 10 so as to allow the bill to be passed into law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor more than five days after the veto message.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, we've discussed the pros of the override and this is merely the technique that's used. I would ask you to please override the Governor's veto of 586.

PRESIDENT: Well, the question before us is the suspension of the rules.

SENATOR MILLS: Oh, okay.

PRESIDENT: Did you want to be heard, Senator Schmit? Your light is on. All right. Record your vote. Shall the rules be suspended to permit a vote beyond the five day period? Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 9 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Rules are suspended.

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
