

and I would agree with the concept of the bill. We are taxing things that really do not involve public transfers and I, personally, even though it might be nominal, would support the concept.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, to answer Senator Marsh's legitimate question. Those fees that she is concerned about are paid. This is a tax. This is a separate tax. It is a plain and simple tax and all we are saying is we want uniformity and it is a legitimate objection. In other words, you can go one way, but when they did the law, they never made it so you could go the other and so it is a very legitimate bill and, yes, small amounts of money are involved but it is still right, you know.

PRESIDENT: Senator Don Dworak moves that the bill be advanced. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. We go to 766.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 766 was a bill introduced by the Banking, Commerce and Insurance Committee and signed by the members thereof. Title read. The bill was read on January 10th of this year. It was referred to the Banking, Commerce and Insurance Committee. There are committee amendments pending, Mr. President, by Senator DeCamp's committee.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I move the adoption of the committee amendments. Mr. President, the committee amendments go right along with the nature of the bill. The Insurance Department requested it. It is to make sure that there is not discrimination, Shirley Marsh would be interested in this, in insurance policies so that, for example, the rates for a, what, divorced woman are the same as the rates for a woman in general. Just to make sure that they have authority to enforce nondiscrimination policies. So I move adoption of the amendments and the bill and I think that is the explanation of the whole thing.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of the committee amendments. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the committee amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp moves that the bill be advanced. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. We go to LB 576. Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, the only amendment to that is the emergency clause and I would move for the emergency clause, I think.
