LB 373, 271, 711, 87, 871

I move that LB 373 be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: All in favor say aye, contrary say nay. The bill is advanced.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move that LB 271 be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: All in favor say aye, contrary say nay. The bill is advanced.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move the E & R amendments to LB 711 be adopted.

PRESIDENT: All in favor say aye, contrary say nay. They are adopted.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move that LB 711 be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: All in favor say aye, contrary say nay. The bill is advanced.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move the E & R amendments to LB 87 be adopted.

PRESIDENT: All in favor say aye, contrary say nay. They are adopted.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move that LB 87 as amended be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: All in favor say aye, contrary say nay. The bill is advanced. Now could we have some order? Senator Koch wants to speak to the body. Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President, I have visited with the Speaker and he has allowed me permission to place an amendment before the body before we adjourn, if we are so going to do at the present time. I placed on each members' desk a statement from the Department of Education, the fact that if we do not do something with LB 871 that we are in danger of losing a million and a half dollars of federal monies for handicapped children. Next year we jeopardize it to the amount of four million and the following year to the amount of six million. I am asking special permission of this body to move LB 871 as amended and place it on E & R Initial. That is my request. The amendments are printed in the Journal if anybody wants to look at them.
