CLERK: Mr. President, LB 871 was a bill introduced by the Education Committee and signed by the members thereof. Title read. The bill was read on January 16th of this year. It was referred to the Education Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. All right, Mr. Clerk.


