

Cindy Larson, Lee, Wes, and Sandra Bruce. Would you stand and be recognized. Thank you all for being here and bringing your grandchildren. We go to Senator Marsh's motion to return LB 922.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Marsh moves to return LB 922 to Select File for a specific amendment. That amendment being to remove the emergency clause.

SENATOR MARSH: I'll temporarily withdraw that motion.

PRESIDENT: We go to Senator Chamber's motion to return LB 184.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, LB 184 is the notorious, so-called, antilitter bill. It is not effective as far as what its stated intent is and that stated intent is to clean up litter throughout the state. The true intent, as was pointed out by a handout from Senator Cullan, is to try to prevent those who are circulating a petition to get the bottle bill on the ballot...it is to prevent them from obtaining enough signatures. I'm going to try not to take much time because we are in the last few days of the session but I gave you a handout some days ago giving specific and precise figures as to how much each of your cities will receive from this largess which will be realized under Senator DeCamp's so-called antilitter bill. Senator Burrows, your town will get \$98.05. With this you are to start a youth corp and it is mandated that your city do that to clean up all of the litter in your city. Senator Lamb, you get \$54.59. Not you, but all of the people in your city. Senator Kremer, you do a bit better. Your town gets \$126.34. Senator Carsten, and I'm using this method because I was taught it by Senator DeCamp on a much more controversial bill than this and one which damaged people far more than this will damage them. Senator Carsten, \$47.30. Senator Frank Lewis, where are you Senator Frank Lewis, your town which was so devastated or parts of your county but your town gets \$2,990.77. So far you are the top money getter under this bill. Senator Schmit, your town gets \$80.94. Senator Mills, \$109.39. Senator Walter George from the small city of Blair, \$1,047.36. This is to start a youth corp. Senator Barnett be patient, we're coming to you. While we're getting to some of these other towns, Burton gets the grand total of \$7.50. No Senator lives there. Senator Hefner, you get \$117.47. Senator Don Dworak, you get \$2,732.21 which is not too bad. We go on to the next one. Senator Merz of Falls City, \$962 even. Senator Barry Reutzel, Fremont, \$4,014.88. Senator Duis, \$946.15 and in between is a little town Granton, I Guess, G R A N T O N, \$9.42. Then we come to this whopping total for Senator Ralph Kelly of Grand Island, \$5,622.63. Then Groth gets \$8.08. I just wanted you to see what some of these towns are going to be left to work with. Senator Marvel, \$4,018.53. Senator Sam Cullan, \$153.03. I wonder how many people can be hired in Hemingford all summer to clean up litter for \$153.03. Senator Richard Lewis, \$57.68.
