LB 210

Randy Duerr. Thank all three of you for being here. Senator Fitzgerald moves that the call be raised. Record your vote. We go to LB 210. All right, report the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay to raise the call Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The call is raised. LB 210.

CLERK: Mr. President, the E and R amendments were adopted by the body on March 13. It failed to advance as of that date. I now have pending amendments offered by Senator Don Dworak. Those amendments, Mr. President, may be found in your bill book. They were printed separately.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dworak, before we start, I would like to introduce 24 juniors from Lawrence High School, in Lawrence, Nebraska. They are in the south balcony and that's in Nuckolls County which is part of Senator Kremer's District. Thank you for being with us this morning. And Jack Mills has a guest under the south balcony from Big Springs, Mr. Frank Kjeldgaard. Frank, thank you for being with us. Now, Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President and colleagues, as indicated by the clerk, my amendment is in the bill book. In the first part of it. It's a lengthy amendment. About 13 pages and it really comprises of two concepts and I'd like to ask the clerk, I'd like to move that this amendment be divided into two portions. The division would... the first part of the question would be from pages 1 through 11 and the second portion would be 12 through 13. The basic two concepts and I'd like to so move.

CLERK: Senator I'd like to inquire...is the break off section 16 or section 17 then in your amendment?

SENATOR DWORAK: The amendment would have to be broken off at section 16.

CLERK: Section 16 in the first part?

SENATOR DWORAK: I'm sorry. Section 15 would have to be the splitting point.

CLERK: So, Section 16 will be in your second motion, if you will?

SENATOR DWORAK: Section 15 and Section 16 would be in the second portion.

CLERK: Oh, okay, so it's one through 14, then 15...

SENATOR DWORAK: Correct. I could give a brief explanation of that but I think...I will give a brief explanation on that motion.

PRESIDENT: It is the opinion of the chair that this is a divisible question since a question remains after a division. Therefore, we will consider the amendment down through Section 14.

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
