

make sure that one child has a future which is normal, with dignity and be able to enjoy the things that you and I enjoy. Senator Venditte said that we have no statistics on this. I disagree with him. Doctors advise me that in most cases they do not report these statistics. Yet, they realize that that could well have been the cause for miscarriage or for the defect. To satisfy Senator Venditte or Senator Maresh one more time the female applicant at the time they apply for the license, if they can demonstrate with a physician's statement that they should not take this shot, if they are not immune, they will not have to take it. So all of the safeguards are built in, and to Senator Maresh I would also remind that even though he did pass a bill in 1973 that all children should be immunized, the fact is that they are not. Today schools are forcing children to go home and stay there until they get the shots. If you don't believe that, just recently in the State of Iowa there were 250,000 children who could not enter school until they had met the requirement of immunization. A year ago in California they were up to 460,000 children that they would not allow in the school because they had a severe outbreak of rubella. So, I submit to you that just because we have a bill into law that children should be immunized, doesn't necessarily mean that they will be. Because we are a very mobile society today in America and there is no way that you can check on it unless everyone and school boards particularly would say that they shall have this before they can enter school and give medical evidence that they do have immunizations. I ask for the advancement of LB 737 to E & R Initial.
