SENATOR FOWLER: Yes, I may.

PRESIDENT: Well, we had better look at it now then to see if it is two subjects and so forth, but at least for now, it is withdrawn?

SENATOR FOWLER: Right.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Lamb. You wanted to talk on the bill?

SENATOR LAMB: I guess I missed out on the conversation, if there was any, which explained what the bill was all about. I guess I would ask Senator DeCamp to sort of start at the beginning and explain what the bill does.

PRESIDENT: Where is he? He has been in his office. He will be right here.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, the bill simply provides a system so that people that get terminated have an opportunity to maintain the same insurance for a certain period of time and it is done in such a way that businessmen can live with it. It adds no additional cost to them. It is just a system for them to not be cut off from insurance immediately. Is that essentially correct, Senator Duis? Six months. I guess I thought I explained that at the beginning but maybe it wasn't understandable.

PRESIDENT: Senator Jerry Koch asks for the previous question. Are there five seconds? There are. Record your vote. Have you voted? Senator Koch, it might be faster to just go ahead and hear the last person. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: There are no further lights on now. Senator Duis, would you close debate please on the motion to advance or Senator Fitzgerald.

SENATOR DUIS: I will go ahead and move that the bill be advanced.

PRESIDENT: Senator Fitzgerald. All right, that is the question. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on the advancement of the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. We go to 861.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 861 was a bill introduced by Jerome Warner. Title read. The bill was read on January 16th of this year. It was referred to the Urban Affairs Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are pending Urban Affairs Committee amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator George, committee amendments.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, the committee put the emergency clause on the bill and I move for the adoption of the committee amendment.
