Senator Cullan and Senator Marvel. Title read. The bill was read on January 11th of this year. It was referred to the Education Committee. It was advanced to General File, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cullan. Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: In view of the intense interest in vocational technical education this time, I move that 702 be advanced to E & R for Review.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion. Senator Koch moves to indefinitely postpone LB 793.

PRESIDENT: Are you ready for that question? The question is, shall this bill be indefinitely postponed? Record your vote. Have you voted? Have you voted right? Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 6 ayes, 18 nays on the motion to indefinitely postpone, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right, that motion fails then. The question then is the advancement of the bill. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 8 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Read it in.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Marsh asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 658. Mr. President, Senator Schmit asks unanimous consent to unbracket LB 424.

PRESIDENT: No objections, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Koch asks unanimous consent, just a second. Mr. President, two new resolutions, 204 introduced by Cullan, Koch that calls for an interim study and will be referred to the Executive Board. LR 205 introduced by Senator Keyes and Senator Clark also calls for an interim study. It will be referred to the Executive Board, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Mr. President, this is another one of these labor contracts. This one deals with, I believe, the correctional...

CLERK: Department of Correctional Services.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: ...Department of Correctional Services and is the same as the other three that we have already handled and we are asking that it be referred to the Business and Labor Committee.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. Record your vote. Please vote. This requires 25 votes. Will you please vote? Senator Clark. Come on vote. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: It is so referred. Anything further, Mr. Clerk?
