LB 692, 722, 773

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I move the bill be re-advanced.

SENATOR MILLS: All those in favor signify by saying aye. Those opposed no. Motion carried. Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Is it in order for me now to ask to have it returned again to add the emergency clause?

SENATOR MILLS: Contrary to Senator Lewis' opinion, it is.

SENATOR SCHMIT: So move.

SENATOR MILLS: The motion is, shall LB 692 be returned for specific amendment. All those in favor signify by saying aye. Excuse me, machine vote. All those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote nay. Record. Senator Schmit.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I move the adoption of the emergency clause.

SENATOR MILLS: The question is, shall the amendment be adopted? Record. The amendment is adopted. All those in favor of advancing the bill signify by saying aye. Those opposed no. The bill is advanced. The Clerk will read LB 722. Mr. Clerk, before reading the bill, for those who are visiting as Senator Savage introduced, we are on Final Reading and the Clerk will be reading the full bill before it can be voted upon by the Legislature. That is a constitutional provision and they must be read so he will be reading and then there will be a vote on LB 722.

CLERK: (Read LB 722 on Final Reading.)

SENATOR MILLS: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is shall LB 722 be passed? Record your vote. Senator Mills voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Mills voting aye.

SENATOR MILLS: Record.

CLERK: (Read record vote found on page 1927 of the Journal.) 42 ayes, 0 nays, 1 excused and not voting and 6 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SENATOR MILLS: The Clerk will read LB 773.

CLERK: (Read LB 773 on Final Reading.)

SENATOR MILLS: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 773 pass. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Have you all voted. Senator Mills voting aye.

CLERK: Mills voting aye.

SENATOR MILLS: Record.

CLERK: (Read record vote found on page 1928 of the Journal.) 43 ayes, 0 nays, 1 excused and not voting and 5 present and not voting, Mr. President.
