SENATOR SAVAGE: Senator Luedtke, did you wish to return to the Chair and sign some bills?

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on E & R respectfully reports that we have carefully examined and reviewed LB 917 and recommend the same be placed on Select File with amendments. 793 placed on Select File with amendments. 692 placed on Select File with amendments.

Mr. President, your committee on E & R respectfully reports that we have carefully examined and engrossed Legislative Bill 700 and find the same correctly engrossed, 700A correctly engrossed.

Mr. President, your committee on E & R respectfully reports that we have carefully examined LB 903 and find the same correctly enrolled, 889A, 889, 855, 851, 184 and 44 all correctly enrolled.

Mr. President, LB 800, there are no E & R amendments pending. However, Senator Kremer offers an amendment found on page 1380 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR SAVAGE: The Chair recognizes Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, the amendments that I am proposing here is actually bringing LB 887 into this bill. LB 887 was heard by the Public Works Committee and it had to do with telecommunications, the dispute between the telephone people and the public power people. The committee asked these two groups to get together if they possibly could and resolve their own problem, which they did. It is a compromise between these two groups of service to Nebraska, the telephone people and the public power people. I think that they have done a good job. So LB 887 is actually Senator Clark's bill. I think that I would yield to Senator Clark and let him explain LB 887 because it is a part of LB 800. I do move that my amendment to LB 800 be adopted.
