CLERK: Mr. President, I have nothing further on the bill.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Motion to advance the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 800A, there are no E & R amendments pending.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Motion to advance 800A. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. 800A is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 248, there are E & R amendments pending.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: There are only E & R amendments are they not?

CLERK: No sir, we have to adopt the E & R's first and then we will go from there.

SENATOR KREMER: I move the E & R amendments be adopted.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Motion to advance the E & R amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. They are advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first amendment I have then is offered by Senator Mills. Senator Mills' amendment may be found on page 831 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Chair recognizes Senator Mills from Big Springs.

SENATOR MILLS: Clerk, what page was that again?

CLERK: 331, Senator.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, this was an amendment that I was asked to put on LB 248. As you are well aware that bill deals with the motor vehicle licensing board and there has been some feeling by the industry that perhaps those persons serving upon that board that their term should be limited by law rather than a continual reappointment. This would say that no member shall serve more than two consecutive terms. Those terms are three years so those members would serve six years. That is the information that I have, Mr. President, that there would not be a great exodus from the board at this time because they are somewhat staggered. I move the adoption of the amendments.
