CLERK: Senator Marvel voting aye.

SENATOR MARVEL: Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to suspend the rules, Mr. President.

SENATOR MARVEL: Okay, the motion, the way the motion read, the rules have been suspended and the bill has been advanced to E & R for engrossment. Okay, we have suspended the rules. All those in favor of advancing the bill, say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. The resolution is advanced to E & R for engrossment. Now, Senator Newell, would you turn off your light please. Are we waiting on something else?

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Let me just say this, members of the Legislature, if we get these two bills back, we just want them on returns, so it will save us time next week and anything we can do to save the time with E & R next week will be helpful. We do not have to have this many people around here to do this to adjourn but let me tell you what the plan is for next week so you know what to expect. We can get bills off of Select File Monday morning. E & R has assured me that if we work diligently Monday morning that we can get those bills and move along and just go ahead with our schedule for sine die Friday, and maybe even possibly Thursday, if we don't run into any trouble. Now, so the agenda for Monday is going to call for Select File all Monday morning. After lunch, we are going to take up the report from Senator Warner on overrides and take care of the overrides at that time, followed by Final Reading in the afternoon. Tuesday, if we can meet on Tuesday, we will follow with reports, resolutions and Final Reading, and obviously, if we go straight through, then it will be Wednesday for all the final action on Final Reading, and then Thursday we can meet to override or Friday, depending upon what the situation is. So it looks like we can go straight through and take care of all the matters. I, also, report to you, I talked to the Governor today. He has assured us that he will cooperate with us if we will cooperate with him by getting the overrides as soon as we can so that he knows what the total fiscal impact will be because that is what he is using as his criteria for some of his vetoes. So if we will move along with our attempts at overrides so that he knows where we are, he will then move as quickly as he can to get them back to us, notwithstanding the five days that he has. He has done this in the past. I have no reason to believe he won't cooperate with us to get out of here either Thursday or Friday. So it looks good.

SENATOR MARVEL: Senator Koch, do you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR KOCH: Yes, I do, Mr. Speaker. A point that I would like to come to a decision on, and I think this body should be able to do it, I would like to know, and I think there are others, are we going to adjourn sine die on Thursday or are we going to take Thursday off and do it on Friday. I think that there are a number of us that have plans that are still flexible but I think for all of us it is to our benefit to make a determination. Either
