SENATOR MURPHY: I will tell you, Senator, I concur with you totally. I do not think that bingo should be used commercially as it is now being done. I join you in your opposition to that and I concur in that manner those who cannot afford it are the most abused by it.

CLERK: 8 ayes, 20 nays on the adoption of Senator Chambers amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Motion fails.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I move the bill as amended be advanced.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right. Any discussion. Senator Newell, do you wish to discuss? All right, the question is, who said machine?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Nobody.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All those in favor of advancing LR 351. You request a machine vote. All right. We will vote by the board then. All those in favor of advancing LR 351 vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the advancement of the bill.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: He wants a record vote. Is that what you want, Senator Chambers?

CLERK: Record vote read. (See page 2022, Legislative Journal.) 31 ayes, 1 nay, 17 not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: LR 351 advances to F & R engrossment. The next bill is LR 386. Yes, a message.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a message from the Governor. Read. (See pages 2022 - 2024, Legislative Journal.)
