LB 783

SENATOR BARNETT: You have got one coming. Does someone want to move for the adoption of the E & R amendments.

SENATOR CULLAN: I move the adoption of the E & R amendments.

SENATOR BARNETT: The question is the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 783. All in favor say aye, all opposed? The amendments are adopted.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I move that LB 783 as amended be advanced to E & R for Engrossment.

SENATOR BARNETT: Sorry, about that...

CLERK: Mr. President, the first amendment that I have is offered by Senator Keyes.

SENATOR BARNETT: Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: What is that on?

SENATOR BARNETT: LB 783.

CLERK: Read Keyes amendment.

SENATOR KEYES: That simply states that any amount of money that the NRD's are going to spend, above \$100,000 will have to be approved by the Legislature. I'd move we adopt the amendment.

SENATOR BARNETT: Do you have that amendment up there Pat? Senator Keyes has explained. Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. President, I oppose the amendment offered by Senator Keyes. I don't think that we are at the place where we are going to have to approve an amendment like that at this time. I oppose this amendment.

SENATOR BARNETT: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I strongly support Senator Kremer's position in opposition to Senator Keyes position. I think that we should give a red vote on Senator Keyes amendment.

SENATOR BARNETT: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? I do. The question is to cease debate. All in favor will vote aye, opposed vote no. Question is to cease debate. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 4 nays to cease debate Mr. President.

SENATOR BARNETT: Senator Keyes, you may close on your amendment to LB 783.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. Speaker, fellow senators. The only reason that I introduced this was to let you know that when Sarpy County, Douglas County and the eastern Missouri River have nobody serving on the board, I think that we should have something to say about it. I'll withdraw the amendment.
