LB 170, 783

SENATOR BARNETT: LB 783 is advanced. LB 877. Senator Kelly. That one is gone? Okay, I'm sorry. LB 170 then I believe, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are E & R amendments to LB 170.

SENATOR BARNETT: Senator Sam.

SENATOR CULLAN: What's the number?

SENATOR BARNETT: 170.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move the E & E amendments to LB 170 be adopted.

SENATOR BARNETT: The question is to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 170. All in favor say aye. All opposed. The amendments are adopted. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Carsten now moves to amend. The amendment reads as follows: (Read Carsten amendment found on page 2049 of the Journal.)

SENATOR BARNETT: Senator Carsten. These are your amendments.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Is there another part to that?

CLERK: Well it just says on page 13, line 4 strike the new matter and reinstate the stricken. Two parts.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Yes, okay. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, what this does is to make the system uniform so we don't have one unit that's one way and one another but units that will work together. It creates a uniform system. The second part of it is to put the approval of these systems under both the Department of Revenue and the Auditor. Heretofore, that Auditor part was stricken. This is reinstated so that both have to approve of the systems. I move for the adoption of the amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR BARNETT: Senator Kahle.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Chairman, members, I'd like to ask Senator Carsten a question. What does this number do to 170?

SENATOR CARSTEN: The only thing it does, Senator Kahle, is to make any equipment that is used in the computer system to be compatible, one with the other, and also for the use of that equipment would have to be approved by both the Director of Revenue and the State Auditor.

SENATOR KAHLE: If the county has its own equipment what happens? Would they still have to put it on the state computer?

SENATOR CARSTEN: No, they do not have to. They can do that as they see fit.

SENATOR KAHLE: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR BARNETT: Senator Rumery, then Senator Dworak.
