SPEAKER LUEDTKE: No, if they have any specific question they can come up and look at it.

CLERK: Senator Dworak moves to return LB 632. Senator R. Lewis moves to return LB 814. Senator F. Lewis moves to return LB 965. Senator Chambers moves to return LB 932. Senator Schmit moves to return LB 910A. Senator Warner moves to return 875. Senator Merz moves to return 800A. Senator Lamb to return 872. Senator Keyes to return 708. Senator Carsten to return 965. Senator Mills to return 128. Senator Schmit to return 910. Senator Warner to return 965.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: That is fourteen motions now.

CLERK: Well and Senator Simon has one on 713.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Chair recognizes Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Chairman, are we indeed going to be in recess on Thursday. I think that is an issue that is important to a number of us.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Yes, yes we are. That is what I just said. That is what I just said. That will be the plan. That is correct sir.
